On behalf of the Nominations Committee (Lucy Westbrooke, Patrick Weber, Suddarth Wranakulasuriya, and Diane Skiba), I invite nominations for the IMIA NI vice chair positions. To serve as one of the Vice Chairs, you need to be the society representative. Your appointment to the position would start in January 2025. There are four positions open. Here are the four vice chair positions and their descriptions as described in the IMIA NI bylaws.

- 1. Role of the Vice Chair for Administration/Finance would include:
- Knowing what funds are available from IMIA.
- Generating income to improve the financial state of the group.
- Keeping adequate records of meetings and looking ahead, ensuring meeting agendas are prepared and communicated in advance
- 2. Role of the Vice Chair for Communications would include:
- Promoting IMIA NI's activities internationally and across IMIA member countries.
- Acting as a conduit between the IMIA NI Board, Working Group (Advisory Panels)
 Chairs and General Assembly members, and ensuring they are properly informed
- Maintaining the website and using other communication media to disseminate information and ensure the nursing informatics and the nursing community are informed of the group's strategies, activities and plans.
- 3. Role of the Vice Chair for Membership would include:
- Ensuring new members have adequate information about the operation of the group.
- Encouraging new membership from the nursing informatics community.
- Maintaining a Membership Database.
- 4. Role of the Vice Chair for Advisory Panels would include:
- Supporting the development of new Advisory Panels.
- Co-ordinating regular report on the activities of the Advisory Panels.
- Ensuring publication of Advisory Panels activities.

You may self-nominate, or you can be nominated by one of your society representative colleagues. To help the nominating committee, please submit a paragraph of your work in the field and your contributions to IMIA NI. Your submission can be sent to Diane.Skiba@CUAnschutz.edu.
